



Meadow Valley Flooding Events



The Sand Springs Police Department's goal is to keep you informed about the procedures that will be used to warn you in the event that a flood event is anticipated to impact the Meadow Valley Subdivision. Please take note of the following points:

1. In the event that water enters the neighborhood and it is anticipated that it will exceed curb height in the lowest portions of the neighborhood, attempts will be made to notify you through several methods such as:
 - Storm Siren - A Hi-Lo tone will be sounded to warn citizens of the danger that is anticipated.
 - Phone Notification - The Civic Ready phone notification system will be used to call each home in the area. Please make sure you are registered by going to www.sandspringspolice.org and click on the link that looks like a phone receiver.
 - Police Officers and Firefighters in vehicles using PA Announcements.
2. Our public safety personnel will generally not make you evacuate unless a state of emergency has been declared. It is up to each person to understand the risks of not leaving the area. Water inside the neighborhood can seem calm, but there are currents and undertows that can sweep a person from their feet. It is a best practice to stay out of the area until the water has receded. **If you are unable to evacuate yourself from the area, please call 911.**
4. In the event that an evacuation warning is given, Officers will block off the outside lane and shoulder of Highway 51.
5. When you leave please secure your residence and take pets and valuables with you..
6. Until the area is deemed safe to return to, officers will be present at each entrance to the neighborhood. Entry into the neighborhood will be limited to those who can provide proof of being a resident. This is to guard against looting of homes in the effected area.
7. If at anytime during the event you need a question answered, please go to a police officer or firefighter at one of the entrances to the neighborhood. Please do not call our dispatch as they will be very busy with calls.
8. If evacuation is necessary, we will supply you with information regarding emergency shelter as soon as possible.

Areas indicated in red are possible locations for parking. Best practice is to relocate vehicles to another location within the city during the event.

Areas indicated in white should not be blocked as it is access for emergency vehicles into the area.
