All-Black Towns of Oklahoma **Now thru Mar 31st**

Shortly after the 1889 Land Run opened the Oklahoma Territory to settlement, black leaders hoped to make the newly-opened lands a home for oppressed African Americans throughout the United States. Oklahoma was promoted as the land where African Americans could come for the dream of “self-government.” As many as fifty communities arose where only African Americans lived and governed themselves. Even though “Jim Crow” became the law of the land after statehood, some All-Black towns survived and continue to thrive in modern Oklahoma.
